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## Pupil premium grant expenditure: Report to parents: 2017/18

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**Background:** The Pupil Premium is currently allocated to disadvantaged pupils in both mainstream and non mainstream settings, children who have been looked after continuously for more than 6 months, and pupils from Service families.

Schools are free to spend the Pupil Premium as they see fit. However we will be held accountable for how we have used the additional funding to support the pupils described above.

We are required to publish online information about how we have used the Premium. This will ensure that parents and others are made fully aware of the attainment of pupils covered by the Premium and the extra support that they receive.

## Measuring the impact of PPG spending

**2016-17:**

### **Year R – 9 FSM pupils, 7 Service children**

94% of FSM children made good or better progress across the Early Years curriculum.

100% of service children made good or better progress across the Early Years curriculum with 56% exceeding their targets.

### **Year 1 – 7 pupils FSM, 6 Service Children**

71% of FSM children made good or better progress across maths and English.

94% of service children made good or better progress across maths and English.

### **Year 2 – 6 pupils FSM, 5 Service Children**

62% of FSM children made good or better progress across maths and English.

87% of service children made good or better progress across maths and English.

**2 LAC pupils-** made progress with individual targets and significant gains in confidence as a result of support

As a result of additional academic and pastoral support pupil's self confidence increased significantly which had an impact on progress.
