Dear Parents,

This week we have pretended to be Steve Backshall going on an adventure through the fearsome jungle. We wrote brilliant news reports, detailing what we saw, heard and felt. The children role played going on an expedition where they saw a slithery scaly snake who eats people and lays gigantic eggs! In Phonics this week we have continued to look at the digraphs **oa** (goat in a boat) **ow** (blow the snow) and started to learn the split digraph **o-e** (phone home).

In Maths we have been looking at subtraction and using a number line to jump backwards. We have also started to look at word problems and taking away different amounts. Over the last few weeks, we have been using Purple Mash in school- learning how to create a picture of an animal using 2Publish. We are now very good at this!
