### Mufti Day for Lottie

Friday 26th May

*We are holding a mufti day on Friday 26th May to raise money and awareness for a wonderful, brave, local little girl called Lottie, who was diagnosed with high risk neuroblastoma when she was 2.5years old. She has responded well to an extensive regime of chemotherapy and stem cell transplant but has a high risk of relapse, the survival of which is very low. In order to prevent this there is the option of clinical trials overseas which are not funded by the NHS and can cost hundreds of thousands of pounds. Supporting Lottie's fundraising campaign will help to ensure that, if Lottie's family choose this route for her as part of her cancer therapy, they have the funds to do this, and realise their aspirations for their little girl.*
